IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT Matthew D. Jamin be, and hereby is, appointed as part-time United States Magistrate Judge at Kodiak, Alaska, at the salary fixed by the Judicial Conference of the United States.

Matthew D. Jamin will enter upon the performance of his duties on the 1st day of November 2004.

Matthew D. Jamin to hold and discharge the duties of his office for a term of four (4) years from the date of his appointment, subject to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. §631, unless sooner removed.

Matthew D. Jamin will perform the duties prescribed by 28 U.S.C. §636, and is specially designated to try persons accused of, and to sentence persons convicted of, minor offenses as defined in 18 U.S.C. §3401, and to perform such additional duties as may now or hereafter be prescribed or referred to in the local rules of this court, said duties being under the authority granted by 28 U.S.C. §636, and not inconsistent with the Constitution and laws of the United States.

The Clerk of the Court is directed to forward a certified copy of this Order to the Director of the Administrative Office of the United States Courts as required by 28 U.S.C. §631(h).
