MANDATORY COURT APPEARANCES OR ARRESTS

Recognizing the concern of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service regarding recidivists and aggravated offenses, it is herein provided that if, within the discretion of the law enforcement officer, the offense is of an aggravated nature, the law enforcement officer, notwithstanding the preceding Forfeiture of Collateral Schedule, may require mandatory appearance before the presiding United States Magistrate Judge. Nothing herein shall prohibit the law enforcement officer from arresting a person for the commission of any offense, including those for which collateral may be posted and forfeited and taking said person immediately before a United States Magistrate Judge.
