The POWER Act requires the Chief Judge of each Judicial District to hold at least one annual event "in partnership with a State, local, tribal or territorial domestic violence service provider or coalition and a State or local volunteer lawyer project, promoting pro bono legal services as a critical way in which to empower survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault and stalking and engage citizens in assisting those survivors."
