IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT: Upon the unanimous vote of the judges of the court, Deborah M. Smith be, and she hereby is, re-appointed as full-time United States Magistrate Judge with chambers in Anchorage, Alaska, at the salary fixed by the Judicial Conference of the United States.

Deborah M. Smith will enter upon the performance of her duties on the 5th day of February 2015.

Deborah M. Smith to hold and discharge the duties of her office for a term of eight (8) years from the date of her appointment, subject to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 631, unless sooner removed.

Deborah M. Smith will perform the duties prescribed by 28 U.S.C. § 636, and is specially designated to try persons accused of, and to sentence persons convicted of, minor offenses as defined in 18 U.S.C. § 3401, and to perform such additional duties as may now or hereafter be prescribed or referred to in the local rules of this court, said duties being under the authority granted by 28 U.S.C. § 636, and not inconsistent with the Constitution and laws of the United States.

The Clerk of the Court is directed to forward a certified copy of this Order to the Director of the Administrative Office of the United States Courts as required by 28 U.S.C. §631(h).
